Digging In:

Read Revelation 19:1-5.

- The great multitude is most likely the Church (7:9-17) of believers now in heaven. Over what are they rejoicing?
- “Babylon” stands for the apostate church, anti-Christian forces including the Antichrist; the great enemy of the true Church.

- Note: Hallelujah, “*Praise the Lord*,” is found only here in the New Testament. Handel’s *Hallelujah Chorus* is based on these verses.

Read 19:6-9.

- What two main reasons cause the huge chorus to rejoice in vv. 6 & 7?
- What is the significance of the statement that the bride *was given* her clothing to wear that made her ready for the big Day? (v.8)

(Note: “righteous acts” can also be translated “righteousness,” or “the righteous verdict” that is, what Jesus earned and gives to his bride. If left as “righteous acts” these are only acts which the righteous can do, and that by God alone through faith.)

- In what ways does the word “Blessed” (v. 9) reach new levels in heaven for invited believers ?
- What does the angel’s final statement, “*These...of God*” (v. 9) seek to do for the reader?

Application:

- * Why is it proper for believers in heaven to rejoice over the final and eternal (smoke rises forever) judgment of God’s and our enemies, such as Babylon? (cf. also Rev. 6:9-11)
- * When did God first invite us to this wedding of the Lamb?

Closing Prayer Suggestion: CW Hymn #10:1,4

- Note: Hallelujah, “*Praise the Lord*,” is found only here in the New Testament. Handel’s *Hallelujah Chorus* is based on these verses.

Read 19:6-9.

- What two main reasons cause the huge chorus to rejoice in vv. 6 & 7?
