Grow in the Grace and Knowledge of ... Jesus - 2 Peter 3:18

Parents of young children are always anticipating and celebrating developmental milestones in the life of their children. A mom may watch for that first smile, a dad tries to encourage that first cautious step and both celebrate their child's first recitation of the ABCs.

God celebrates spiritual growth in the life of his children. In His Holy Word he encourages us in our faith development when he says, "Grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ" (2 Peter 3:18). The more time we spend in God's Word, the more he strengthens our faith, assures us of his forgiveness and energizes us for a life of joyful service.

In order to increase opportunities for spiritual development our congregation has now established Growth Groups. These groups of 6-12 like-minded believers dig into the truths of God's Word, encourage one another, share each other's joys and burdens, confess, study, forgive and pray together. Most groups meet in the home of a host family. This relaxing environment helps avoid a "classroom" feel and enables everyone to feel comfortable contributing to the conversation.

Over 60 people participated in the initial kick-off of Growth Groups. There are currently groups meeting as far south as Woodbury and as far north as Forest Lake. These groups include a wide-variety of people. There are single-people, newlyweds, couples who have been married over 50 years, long-time Christians, and a few people who are new to the Christian faith. The broad-spectrum of backgrounds and life-experiences enrich the conversations. Nevertheless, the diversity fades to the background when the unifying power of the Gospel is front and center. What unites all participants is one Lord, one Savior, one baptism, one Holy Spirit who powerfully works through the same message of the Bible.

Just as a parent celebrates a child's first step, so also our congregation celebrates this first step on a journey towards widespread congregational participation in Growth Groups. But just as a child's first couple of steps are cautious, so also, there may be some people who are cautious about joining a Growth Group. "What will I be asked to do?" "I don't know the Bible as well as others." "I would die of embarrassment if asked to pray in front of others." "I don't want to be asked personal questions." These are just a few questions and hesitancies that people may have. In the coming weeks there will be a short video featuring some candid feedback from Growth Group participants. Their stories and feedback may help alleviate apprehensions. If you would like to learn more, please take the time to talk with someone who joined a Growth Group. Or talk with one of the host families or facilitators. They'd be happy to share honest feedback and personal perspectives on what it's like to be in one of these groups. Go ahead, take that first step. You won't be disappointed!

The Menorah: The Seven Gifts of the Spirit

The seven-branched candlestick in the temple was called the menorah. It burned uninterruptedly as worship was made to the continually present God. In the opening chapter of Revelation St. John speaks of the "seven golden lampstands."

Fire is associated with the Holy Spirit. On Pentecost Day the Spirit appeared as with fiery tongues, and Jesus referred to the baptism with the Holy Spirit and with fire. The seven flames of the candlestick were considered emblematic of the seven gifts of the Spirit mentioned in the Scriptures. Isaiah writes (11:2) "The Spirit of the Lord shall rest upon him, the Spirit of wisdom and understanding, the Spirit of counsel and might, the Spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord." The Book of Revelation (4:5) mentions "the seven torches of fire" that burn before God's throne. It speaks in the next chapter of these seven gifts given to the Lamb: power, wealth, wisdom, might, honor, glory, and blessing.

It is not only to Christ that the seven gifts of the Spirit were given. Believers, too, receive them to various degrees. Basic for every Christian is the Holy Spirit's gift of faith in the Savior, Jesus Christ. The seven gifts of the Spirit can also be represented by seven tongues of flame often pictured with the dove, a symbol of the Holy Spirit. These symbols can be seen on Christ Lutheran's red festival banners used for ordinations/installations, Pentecost Sunday (May 24th), and Reformation Sunday (October 25th).




Aluminum Can Collection Drop off your empty aluminum cans by the NSP garage for a recycling rebate.
